

PASTOR'S THOUGHTS

Hey Church Family!

As we celebrate Christmas each year, we are thanking God for fulfilling the prophecy of Isaiah 7:14 which says, "Therefore, the Lord himself will give you a sign: See, the virgin will conceive, have a son, and name him Immanuel." To thank God for fulfilling the prophecy about our Savior, we sing songs like "O Come, O Come Immanuel." But why is Immanuel's coming so important?

Immanuel's arrival matters because the fulfillment of Isaiah 7:14 is all about the faithfulness of God despite the unfaithfulness of humans. To fully understand why this prophecy, and ultimately Christmas, is about the faithfulness of God, we need to consider the history of this prophecy. Isaiah was a prophet who lived about 100 years before Judah got exiled to Babylon, and his book has a theme that's like 2 sides of 1 coin, God's judgment on Israel for not repenting of their idolatry/sin and hope that salvation would come for Israel

2 Kings 15-16 and 2 Chronicles 28 describe the history around Isaiah 7:14. The summary is this. During the lifetime of Judah's king Ahaz, Assyria threatened Israel and Judah. Ahaz's dad was a faithful king who looked to the Lord for protection from Assyria, but Ahaz was wicked and did not trust the Lord to deliver him or Judah from Assyria. So, God sent Isaiah to straighten Ahaz out. In chapter 7, Isaiah tells Ahaz to trust God by 1) recognizing God is greater than Ahaz's circumstances (vv.1-9), 2) admitting God is the only one who can save him (vv. 10-16), and

3) remembering that not trusting God comes with grave consequences (vv.15-25). God spared Judah from being destroyed by Assyria, but the ultimate fulfillment of that prophecy did not happen in the Old Testament because 100 years later Judah was exiled by Babylon.

When did the ultimate fulfillment of Isaiah 7:14 come? It happened at the first Christmas

Matthew 1:18-25, "The birth of Jesus Christ came about this way: After his mother Mary had been engaged to Joseph, it was discovered before they came together that she was pregnant from the Holy Spirit. So her husband, Joseph, being a righteous man, and not wanting to disgrace her publicly, decided to divorce her secretly. But after he had considered these things, an angel of the Lord appeared to him in a dream, saying, "Joseph, son of David, don't be afraid to take Mary as your wife, because what has been conceived in her is from the Holy Spirit. She will give birth to a son, and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins." Now all this took place to fulfill what was spoken by the Lord through the prophet: See, the virgin will become pregnant and give birth to a son, and they will name him Immanuel, which is translated "God is with us." When Joseph woke up, he did as the Lord's angel had commanded him. He married her but did not have sexual relations with her until she gave birth to a son. And he named him Jesus.

Thus, Matthew 1:23 tell us that the ultimate fulfillment of Isaiah 7:14 came when Jesus was born of the Virgin Mary. His birth shows that God remains faithful despite the faithlessness of humanity, seen clearly in Ahaz's life and ours. Immanuel, Jesus, came to save us from our sin because, like Ahaz, we too have rebelled against God. Jesus saved us by growing up and bearing our faithless sin on the cross and giving us new hearts that can obey God. Christmas is all about God being faithful to save us despite our sinful rebellion!

We had a great turn out for our Kids Friendsgiving. We had 13 children in attendance. They all had a great time eating, playing games and making crafts.


Our Children's Christmas party will be Saturday, December 20th from 2:00-4:00. All children are invited.


